What will I do? Interact with High School Students and spread the message of unity, antidiscrimination and tolerance focusing on the paradigm of the Holocaust

What is the activity about?

The ESC volunteering short - term activity is part of the "Remember Holocaust- Building Bridges for a common future" project which focuses on the paradigm of Holocaust as a milestone for highlighting the importance of tolerance, acceptance, diversity and unity for a peaceful coexistence in the EU and beyond. This volunteering activity concerns a set of workshops that will be implemented virtually in High Schools in Greece during which, the volunteers, based on the outcomes of other project activities, will interact with the students and through non-formal approach will discuss upon issues of equity, diversity, tolerance.

The selected participants will be thoroughly trained about what the project has achieved so far, will be given more relevant information and will have the space to organise the context of their workshops according to their profile. The coordinating organisation, Institute of Research & Training on European Affairs, will provide them with the needed support so as to organise the context and the framework of the workshops and will ease any other procedure so that the volunteers feel comfortable to productively express themselves on issues of respect to diversity, tolerance among communities, respect to human rights and vision of a united EU.

Which are the tasks of the activity?

The selected participants should attend all phases of the 2-weeks short term ESC activity which will be carried out virtually. More specifically, the volunteers should:

•Attend the preparatory phase, including 2 online meetings aiming at gaining a thorough view of the project and the ESC activity as well as receiving accurate information about the workshops to be implemented, the methodology and the expected outcomes







- Develop the content of the workshops and, together with the organizing team, reflect and finalize them.
- Implement two virtual workshops for High Schools
- Provide evaluation and feedback to the organizing team.

Detailed Description of the project:

The "Remember Holocaust – Building Bridges for a common future" project, funded by the EU Programme "Europe for Citizens" is an ode to the remembrance of the Jews Holocaust aiming to raise awareness on remembrance and highlighting the EU values of dignity, solidarity, tolerance and peace. All project partners derive from places with a common historical point where the local population has been victimized by the anti-Semitism wave and has suffered great loses during the WWII. The project is implemented by the Institute of Research & Training on European Affairs (Greece), the Youth for Equality organisation (Slovakia), the European Foundation for Human Development (Poland), the Jugend, Bildung und Kultur EV (Germany) and the Community Enterprise of Thessaloniki (Greece) which all of them share a common historical point where the local population has been victimized by the anti-Semitism wave and suffered great loses during the WWII.

Through the project, there have been implemented a set of activities during which young people, High School and Universities students, representatives of the Jewish community, academics, decision-makers at local and regional level as well as policy makers at national level and the representatives of the civil society met, discussed upon issues of tolerance, peace and antidiscrimination. These activities included an online workshop, a virtual Structured Dialogue activity and an online Human Library event.

Around 350 people have been so far engaged to the project coming from more than 10 different European countries and beyond.
